3. Goals, objectives, tasks & priorities

Since BPAC members are already involved in TPS activities, it was unanimous that TPS should be added to the goals as an advisee of BPAC.

4. INCOG Updates

a. Radio-Ad- Will air the last two weeks of April and first two weeks of May. A total of 435 ads will be aired on KVOO & KHITS

b. Bike Share- Alta finished the Bike Share plan for Tulsa. It consists of two phases; each phase will consist of 108 bicycles. The next step is to create a committee to find an Executive Director

c. GOPLAN- Viplav gave a hand out that explains how INCOG evaluates traffic count, which determines which type of bicycle infrastructure is recommended on the GO PLAN. A total of 800 projects have been identified in the GO PLAN.
