Regional Transportation Plan process begins with surveys and outreach guides

INCOG has begun the planning process for the Connections 2035 Regional Transportation Plan.

Every five years, INCOG creates a transportation plan for the Tulsa Transportation Management Area, which includes parts of Creek, Osage, Rogers, and Wagoner counties and all of Tulsa County.

The Regional Transportation Plan (RTP) presents all the improvements for the area transportation system (Roadways, Freight, Bicycle/Pedestrian, and Public Transportation) within the next 25 years. The RTP is not a wish list - all projects and policies are based on anticipated funding.

The plan's vision, priorities, and projects will depend on input from residents and stakeholders.

The planning process is divided into five phases. A timeline is available

at the Connections 2035 website (www.incog.org/transportation/connections2035).

Also at the website is the brochure "How Do You Fit In?", a guide to the transportation planning process, and "Frequently Asked Questions," answers to your questions about the RTP's first phase.

Also on the Connections site is a short Tulsa area trails survey. Survey results will be used to gauge citizens' interest related to trail location, use, and amenities.

A comprehensive survey on other transportation topics will be distributed this summer.

Expanded planning area adds 4,500 residents

During the development of the Destination 2030 Long Range Transportation Plan, a recommendation was made to expand the TMA to include more area to the east in Wagoner County.

After analyzing various alternatives, the Transportation Policy

Committee approved adding an additional 105 square miles with approximately 4,500 residents.

The additional area contains approximately 84 square miles in Wagoner County, including Johnston's Port 33 and the full corporate limits of Coweta. The recom-

mended expansion also contains approximately 21 square miles in Creek County, including the corporate limits of the Town of Mounds.
